Hong Kong Tourism Board Announces June Arrival Figures

The Hong Kong Tourism Board (HKTb) announced today (15 July) that Hong Kong received about 14,600 visitor arrivals in June 2020, representing a daily average of about 500, a 99.7% drop from the same time last year. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, there were 3.52 million visitor arrivals in the first half of the year, a 90% drop year on year.

As the outbreak has recently worsened in Hong Kong, the Spend-to-Redeem local tours, originally scheduled to launch this month, will be postponed in response to the Government's appeal to the public to go out less and practise social distancing. The HKTb will closely follow up on the latest outbreak developments and will announce details and the revised schedule for the campaign in due course.
