

Frequently Asked Questions

I. Online registration

Q1: How much is the registration fee for each category and what does it include?

A1: The registration fee includes a rider pack for each registered person. Participants completing the 50 km and 32 km Rides will be awarded a finisher medal and an e-certificate. The table below lists the enrolment and donation fees for each category:

Q2: Are changes allowed if the information is entered incorrectly?

A2: Yes. Please send an email to the organiser (<u>info@hongkongcyclothon.com</u>) to request a change to any incorrect information, such as emergency contact details. Please include the participant's name, event category, registration reference and the specific information to be updated.

Q3: Can I register for the event through other methods instead of online?

A3: To be environmentally friendly and to provide participants with instant confirmation of payment and enrolment, all registrations will only be processed online.



Q4: Can I pay by credit card for online registration?

A4: Yes.

Q5: Are bike jerseys and shuttle bus fees included in the registration fee?

A5: No. You may purchase the bike jersey for HK\$155 and shuttle bus services for HK\$60 when you register online.

II. Cycling events

Q6: Will teams in the 50 km or 32 km Rides be conducted in a relay format?

A6: No, participants are required to finish the 50 km or 32 km route individually within the designated time limit.

Q7: Why is there a disparity in registration fees between teams and individuals for the 50 km and 32 km Rides?

A7: The objective of setting up the 50 km and 32 km Rides for teams is to raise more funds for the designated charitable beneficiary. Therefore, this category is targeted at organisations or companies, and the entry fee is set at HK\$14,500 and HK\$7,500, respectively. There will be special arrangements for 50 km and 32 km teams, including a prioritised starting position, a designated marquee for teams (inside the event venue) and support/souvenirs, if available.

III. Acceptance of entries and arrangement of Cycling Technique Assessment (CTA)

Q8: What is the registration fee for the Cycling Technique Assessment?

A8: The Cycling Technique Assessment is free for all participants.

Q9: What is the format of the Cycling Technique Assessment?

A9: Participants in the 50 km and 32 km Rides must complete and pass both Parts 1 and 2 of the Cycling Technique Assessment to be eligible for those categories.



Part 1 - Physical Fitness Test

Complete a 6 km cycling course within 16 minutes and 30 seconds in a mass start with other participants.

Part 2 - U-turn Test

Finish the designated route with a narrow U-turn without knocking down any obstacles or putting any body part on the ground.

The organiser and/or the Cycling Association of Hong Kong, China (CAHK) may adjust the standards based on factors like the type of bicycle, difficulty of the Cycling Technique Assessment venue and weather conditions on the assessment day (temperature, humidity, wind and direction).

Q10: When will the Cycling Technique Assessment be held?

A10: The Cycling Technique Assessment will be held on 27 September (Saturday), 28 September (Sunday), 11 October (Saturday) and 12 October (Sunday).

Q11: Who is exempt from the Cycling Technique Assessment?

A11: All 50 km and 32 km Ride participants must complete the Cycling Technique Assessment (CTA), except for:

- 1) those who passed the CTA of the 2024 Sun Hung Kai Properties Hong Kong Cyclothon;
- 2) finishers of the 50 km, 32 km or 30 km Rides in the 2022, 2023 or 2024 Sun Hung Kai Properties Hong Kong Cyclothon;
- 3) those who completed the Cycling Association of Hong Kong, China (CAHK) road races from 1 January 2024 to 1 July 2025;
- 4) those who completed Union Cycliste Internationale road races from 1 January 2024 to 1 July 2025; or
- 5) experienced cyclists who completed other eligible cycling competitions, such as those organised by National Cycling Federations, or mass road events held between 1 January 2024 and 1 July 2025.

If there are any disputes, the organiser has the final decision.



Q12: Can I use my own bike for the Cycling Technique Assessment (CTA) or will bikes be provided?

A12: You may use your own bike or the bikes provided at the venue for the CTA. Your own bike must be a road bike, mountain bike or folding bike with two wheels of equal diameter that is at least 406 mm (for full bike specifications, please refer to Clause 4.1—4.6 under Part B in the Notice to Participants/Terms & Conditions). If you are using a provided bike, you must check it and immediately inform the responsible personnel of any issues. All participants must bring and wear their own helmet during the CTA.

Q13: When do I need to submit proof of my qualification to the organiser?

A13: Registrants must submit valid proof documents through the online registration system before the registration closes at 11:59pm on 20 September 2025 (Hong Kong Time, GMT +8). If you fail to provide the required proof by the deadline, your application will be deemed withdrawn and will not be processed.

Q14: I didn't upload the documents to qualify for an exemption during registration. How can I submit them now?

A14: You can submit the supporting documents by email to info@hongkongcyclothon.com on or before 20 September 2025. The organiser will verify the documents and confirm if you are exempt from the Cycling Technique Assessment.

Q15: Can I participate in the 50 km and 32 km Rides if I don't attend the Cycling Technique Assessment?

A15: No, participants in the 50 km and 32 km Rides must complete the Cycling Technique Assessment to be eligible.

Q16: Can I use a different bike for the Cycling Technique Assessment and the actual event?

A16: Yes, as long as it is a road bike, mountain bike, or folding bike with two wheels of an equal diameter that is at least 406 mm. For full bike specifications, refer to Clauses 4.1—4.6 under Part B in the Notice to Participants/Terms & Conditions.



Q17: Will the registration fee be refunded if I can't participate in the Cycling Technique Assessment and event?

A17: No, all paid fees (registration, jersey, shuttle bus, etc.) are non-refundable, except for withdrawals due to medical reasons with valid proof.

Q18: Will I get a refund if I fail the Cycling Technique Assessment?

A18: Yes, if you fail the assessment, all paid fees will be refunded within 60 days of the Cycling Technique Assessment result announcement via email.

IV. Bike rental services

Q19: Does the organiser provide bikes and gear?

A19: Participants in the 50 km Ride and 32 km Ride are mostly professional or serious amateur cyclists who already own their own bikes. Also, for safety reasons, the organiser encourages these participants to use their own bikes. For non-local participants of the 50 km Ride and 32 km Ride who do not travel with their own bikes, bike rental services will be available on a request basis. Non-local participants can request bike rentals during online registration on a first-come, first-served basis. The Hong Kong Tourism Board is not a bike supplier and is not responsible for any claims or liabilities related to the rentals.

On the other hand, local participants may contact a local bike supplier, Lung Kee Bicycle Company Limited (website: www.lkbike-hk.com/?lang=en / tel: +852 9010 1889), for short-term bike rental. The Hong Kong Tourism Board is not a supplier of the rented bikes and shall not be responsible for any claim or liabilities in relation thereto.



V. Other topics

Q20: I would like to attend a cycling training course in preparation for the event. Where can I find the course details?

A20: The Official Sports Apparel Sponsor – bossini has curated a series of preparatory workshops together with former Cycling Team members of Hong Kong, China and professional coaches. Please visit the website for details: https://www.bossini.com/pages/cyclothon-workshop2025.

Q21: Will a bike deposit service be provided on or before the event day?

A21: No, bike deposit service will not be provided on or before the event day.

Q22: Will participants be offered a refund if the event is re-routed, suspended or cancelled due to adverse weather?

A22: No refunds will be made under any circumstances, except for requests related to withdrawal due to medical reasons with relevant medical documents issued by a medical practitioner registered with The Medical Council of Hong Kong or overseas governmental medical authorities.

Q23: What are the special weather and emergency arrangements for the event day?

A23: The following arrangements will be implemented in the event of adverse weather conditions or emergencies:

Q24: What are the suggested average riding speeds for participants and the closing times of the respective check points along the route?

A24: The suggested average riding speeds for participants of the 50 km Ride and 32 km Ride are 29 km/h and 24 km/h respectively. Participants will be required to board the broom wagon or make a U-turn (as applicable) to proceed to the finish point in West Kowloon if they cannot reach the checkpoint before the respective designated closing times stated in the following tables:
