MTR

The Mass Transit Railway system is clean, efficient and reliable, and covers all major districts in the territory, making it ideal for travellers exploring Hong Kong's various attractions. Octopus cards and credit cards are accepted as payment modes.

Buses

Buses in Hong Kong are plentiful, comfortable and air-conditioned. Route number and destination are displayed, and fares are paid upon boarding, based on distance travelled. Cash (prepare exact change) and Octopus cards are accepted on all buses in Hong Kong.

Taxis

Taxis in Hong Kong are metered, and can be hailed on the street or boarded at taxi stands at malls and MTR stations. There are 3 colours of taxis in Hong Kong serving different locations, but all taxis can travel to and from Hong Kong International Airport and Hong Kong Disneyland.



Red: Operate throughout most of Hong Kong, except for Tung Chung Road and the south side of Lantau Island



Green: Only service the New Territories



Blue: Only operate on Lantau Island

Taxis mainly accept cash, with some offering cashless payments through Octopus cards, Alipay or WeChat Pay. Besides the metered fare, passengers are also expected to pay for any tunnel tolls or surcharges incurred during the taxi ride. Prices will be listed on the inside of the taxi.

Mosques in Hong Kong

Hong Kong is home to several historic mosques that reflect the city's rich Islamic heritage. Each serves as a spiritual anchor for the city's diverse Muslim community.



Kowloon Mosque

📍 105 Nathan Road, Tsim Sha Tsui, Kowloon

Nestled in the heart of the Tsim Sha Tsui shopping belt, Kowloon Mosque is Hong Kong's largest mosque. With its stunning white marble and central dome, Kowloon Mosque blends spirituality and architecture in one of Hong Kong's busiest districts.



Masjid Ammar and Osman Ramju Sadick Islamic Centre

📍 No. 40, Oi Kwan Road, Wan Chai, Hong Kong

Masjid Ammar is famous for being the third mosque ever to be built in Hong Kong. Located in Wan Chai, the Islamic Centre is an eight-storey building with added facilities, and even a Halal-certified canteen which serves authentic Halal dim sum!



Jamia Mosque

📍 30 Shelly Street, Central, Hong Kong

Jamia Mosque, the oldest mosque in Hong Kong built in 1849, features a mint-green exterior and serene atmosphere. Tucked away in Central's Mid-Levels Escalators, it provides a peaceful cultural escape from the city's busy streets.
